North Wildwood, New Jersey – Cape May County Prosecutor Robert L. Taylor and Chief Robert Matteucci of the North Wildwood Police Department announced the culmination of a month long investigation targeting the distribution of cocaine in North Wildwood, New Jersey.

At approximately 9:30 p.m., on July 19, 2007, personnel from the Cape May County Prosecutor's Office Narcotics Task Force, the New Jersey State Division of Criminal Justice Gang and Organized Crime Unit, North Wildwood Police Department and the Cape May County Regional SWAT Team executed a search warrant in the 100 block of West 24th Avenue, North Wildwood, New Jersey, that resulted in the seizure of approximately four and one-half ounces of suspected crack cocaine with a street value of approximately \$12,600, approximately four hundred and forty-five dollars in U.S. currency, under fifty grams of marijuana and drug paraphernalia. A forfeiture action will be filed against the U.S. currency as proceeds from the illegal distribution of Controlled Dangerous Substances.

As a result of the drug seizure, a warrant has been issued for the arrest of Jermaine Milbourne, 31 years old, of the 100 block of West 24 Avenue, North Wildwood, New Jersey. Milbourne was charged with possession of cocaine; a third degree crime, possession of cocaine with the intent to distribute in an amount over one-half ounce; a second degree crime, possession of cocaine with the intent to distribute within 1000 feet of a school zone; a third degree crime, possession of marijuana under fifty grams and possession of drug paraphernalia; both disorderly persons offenses.

Milbourne has not been apprehended at this time and described as a 31 year old black male, 6', 150 lbs., black hair and brown eyes with a scar on the left elbow and a birthmark on his left cheek. Milbourne has previously resided in Millville, New Jersey.

Prosecutor Taylor stated that persons convicted of a second degree crime may be incarcerated in the New Jersey State Prison between five and ten years. People convicted of a third degree crime between three and five years and of a disorderly persons offense up to six months in the County Jail.
