**Cape May Court House, New Jersey** - County Prosecutor Robert L. Taylor followed-up on a news conference held yesterday by the New Jersey State Police and the Attorney General in Trenton announcing numerous raids and arrests involving the violent Nine Trey set of the infamous Bloods street gang. Taylor said that members of his office's Narcotics Task Force, Lower Township Police Department, Wildwood Police Department, and North Wildwood Police Department had assisted the New Jersey State Police in this investigation, which resulted in the arrest of Oscar J. Randall, 30 years old of the unit block of East Pacific Avenue, Villas, New Jersey. Randall was arrested without incident as a result of a search warrant executed at his residence during the early morning hours on Monday. Randall was identified by the state police as a high-ranking member of the Bloods who assisted other gang members run operations in Atlantic City, NJ.

Similar to other locations throughout the state, Cape May County has experienced a significant influx of suspected or known members of the Bloods street gang during the past year. The arrival of these individuals can be attributed to a number of factors; most notably the increased financial opportunities for the gang through the distribution of drugs. Through the State Police investigation dubbed "Operation Nine Connect," and local independent investigations, information was developed that Bloods street gang members are being deployed to rural areas because of the increased amount of funds that can be made in these areas by doubling their profit from the distribution of drugs.

Prosecutor Taylor praised the efforts of the local departments along with his office's Narcotics Task Force and newly formed Intelligence Unit. Information developed by these two units played a pivotal role in the success of the State Police investigation that lasted more than six months. Prosecutor Taylor indicated his office continues to investigate other persons believed to be members of the Bloods and other street gangs conducting illegal narcotics activity in Cape May County.

Working closely with the municipal police departments throughout the County and Sheriff's Department as well as continuing to share intelligence with the New Jersey State Police, Taylor said the law enforcement community in Cape May County has a greater understanding of the extent of the street gang problem. Taylor cited increases in drug

arrests including yesterday's arrest of Randall and the past shooting spree through the streets of Wildwood as examples of this gangs increased presence in the County. The Prosecutor expects additional arrests will result and credits an exceptionally cooperative partnership at all levels of law enforcement in the State.
