Wildwood, New Jersey - Cape May County Prosecutor Robert L. Taylor and Chief Steven Long of the Wildwood Police Department announced the culmination of a month long investigation targeting the distribution of cocaine in Wildwood, New Jersey.

At approximately 10:20 p.m., on July 12, 2007, personnel from the Cape May County Prosecutor's Office Narcotics Task Force, Wildwood Police Department and Wildwood Police Department SWAT Team executed a search warrant in the 100 block of East Spencer Avenue in Wildwood, New Jersey, that resulted in the seizure of approximately one ounce of suspected powder cocaine with a street value of approximately \$2,800, approximately eight hundred and nineteen dollars in U.S. currency and drug paraphernalia.

Lisa Tozer, 30 years old, and Michael Williams, 27 years old, both of the 100 block of East Spencer Avenue, Wildwood, New Jersey, were arrested at the scene. Tozer was charged with possession of cocaine, a third degree crime; possession of cocaine with the intent to distribute in an amount over one-half ounce, a second degree crime; possession of cocaine with the intent to distribute within 500 feet of a certain public place, a second degree crime; and possession of drug paraphernalia, a disorderly persons offense. Tozer was lodged in the Cape May County Correctional Center in lieu of posting \$50,000 bail. Williams was charged with possession of drug paraphernalia and released on a summons.

Prosecutor Taylor stated that persons convicted of a second degree crime may be incarcerated in the New Jersey State Prison between five and ten years, a third degree crime three to five years in the New Jersey State Prison and of a disorderly persons offense up to six months in County Jail. Prosecutor Taylor commended both departments on the successful conclusion of the investigation and indicated that both departments had received a number of citizen complaints concerning the sale of illegal drugs from this location.
