For Immediate Release – September 9, 2011

*Cape May Court House, New Jersey* - Cape May County Prosecutor Robert L. Taylor and Middle Township Police Chief Christopher Leusner announce the arrests of two men wanted in connection with an August 20, 2011 bank robbery in New Hampshire.

On August 20, 2011, an armed white male, later identified as 40 year old David Ogilvie of New Hampshire, entered the Citizens Bank in Rollinsford, New Hampshire with a handgun and demanded money. Ogilvie received an undisclosed amount of cash and exited the bank. Investigation revealed that Ogilvie fled the area with the assistance of a waiting vehicle occupied by a male, later identified as 32 year old Nathan Hurteau and one female, later identified as Isabel Santos. Rollinsford Police identified Santos and she was apprehended shortly after the robbery.

The subsequent investigation revealed that Ogilvie and Hurteau, who also uses the name Nathan Gagnon and has ties to Cape May County, arrived in Cape May County shortly after the robbery. Area police departments were notified by New Hampshire authorities that Ogilvie and Hurteau may be in the area. Middle Township Police and the Cape May County Prosecutor's Office dedicated detectives to apprehend the subjects.

On September 8, 2011 at approximately 11:15pm, the Middle Township Patrol Division located Hurteau at the WAWA convenience store in Cape May Court House and placed him under arrest. Following Hurteau's arrest, the investigation revealed that Ogilvie was in a residence located in the 1000 block of Route 9 South in Cape May Court House. After confirming that Ogilvie was inside the residence, contact was made with him and he surrendered. The Route 9 residence was subsequently searched pursuant to a Court-authorized search warrant where detectives seized a replica firearm and other evidence.

Ogilvie and Hurteau were charged with being Fugitives from Justice and were committed to the Cape May County Correctional Center without bail awaiting extradition to New Hampshire.

Cape May County Prosecutor's Office, Middle Township Police Department, Cape May County Regional SWAT Team, Cape May County Crisis Negotiations Team, Cape May County Sheriff's Department K-9, the Rollinsford (New Hampshire) Police Department , the United States Marshals and the Federal Bureau of Investigation cooperated in this investigation and Prosecutor Taylor and Chief Leusner commend the officers of these departments for their dedication and expertise in locating and apprehending this suspects.
